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Skipton Swim Club Triumphs at the 2025 Long Course Yorkshire Championships!



February was a month to remember for Skipton Swim Club as we took part in the 2025 Long Course Yorkshire Championships, held over three weekends at John Charles Centre for Sports and Ponds Forge International Sports Centre. The championships culminated in the team events on Sunday, 23rd February, with a fantastic showing from our swimmers.

A massive congratulations to the 24 swimmers who qualified and competed in both individual and team events. The performances were outstanding, with numerous personal bests, finalists, and medals earned across various age groups.

In the 17 years and over category, Sam Smith secured gold in the 100m Butterfly and bronze in the 50m Freestyle. Jack Jenkinson also had a strong championships, earning silver in the 200m Free and bronze in both the 100m Free and 200m IM.

The breaststroke events were a highlight for Skipton, with multiple swimmers achieving fantastic results: Will Barnes earned his first-ever Yorkshire medal in the 12-year-old age group, taking bronze in the 100m Breaststroke and gold in the 50m Breaststroke, and a PB of 39.07 seconds.

Stanley Dunne excelled in the 15-year-old age group, claiming gold in the 100m Breaststroke and silver in the 200m Breaststroke.

Quinn Austin Kelly earned silver in the 100m Breaststroke for the 17 years and over category, while Naevia Kelly qualified for her first final in the 100m Breaststroke. Phoebe Oliver took bronze in the 200m Breaststroke.

stroke for the 17 and overs. And Betsy Rider rounded off the breaststroke success with a bronze in both the 50m and 200m Breaststroke for the 14-year-olds.

In total, Skipton Swim Club had 46 finalists across the championships, bringing home 3 golds, 4 silvers, and 8 bronzes!

The team events wrapped up the championship in style, with Skipton entering four teams; 2 open male and 2 female. Both the male and female A teams made it to the finals for both the Medley and Freestyle relays, showcasing the strength and unity of the entire team. The open male team, consisting of Sam Smith, Joe Burgess, Sean Smith and Quinn Austin Kelly, narrowly missed out on third place in the Medley relay final.

A huge thank you to our dedicated coaches and team managers for their unwavering support and commitment. Your hard work and encouragement helped guide our swimmers to these outstanding achievements.

We are incredibly proud of each and every swimmer who competed and represented Skipton Swim Team with such determination and passion. Congratulations to all our swimmers for their amazing performances, and we look forward to more success in the future!........Go Skipton!



Important update from Swim England

Swim England has seen a rise in incidents reported, where mobile phones are being used to take indecent photos or videos under or over cubicles. In line with Swim England, Skipton Swim Club

have a zero tolerance policy towards the use of mobile phones and other digital devices in changing rooms.

The future implications for those who break this policy are serious. Not only could using a mobile device in the changing room lead to **criminal charges** and a **permanent criminal record**, but it could also result in **suspensions** from Swim England. These suspensions would be recorded and could appear on future DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checks, which may severely impact one's employment opportunities in the future.

As incidents continue to be reported, Swim England is likely to focus even more on monitoring and enforcing consequences for violations to ensure that changing rooms remain a safe and secure space for all individuals and to maintain trust and integrity within the sport.
