As the season comes to a close, I wish you all a very The season, and I hope everyone enjoys a well-deserved, relaxing break.



Jack joined the club at the age of eight and steadily rose through the ranks to become a key squad member. A student at Ermysted's Grammar School, Jack was a regular in the school's ESSA relay teams, consistently performing among the top state school swimmers in the country. Jack also gave generously of his time, volunteering as a coach to support younger swimmers—further showing his commitment to the club and its community.
